

Norman G. Wilson served the Rosebud Sioux Tribe and its members as the Tribal President, serving 2 terms (1979-81, 1997-99) and as the Vice President, serving 3 terms (1991-95,2003-05). Norman had the pulse of the people in his heart, never shirked a task when asked by the people, and always put others first before himself. His compassion and steadfast commitment to serve the people helped shape the many decisions he made while in office, and continued to do so while he wasn't an elected official. As one tribal elder, James Black Bull, Sr. had stated, "We have a good leader now in Norman Wilson. He is a Lakota speaker and displays Christianity and spirituality together."
