Alma Jane (Godfrey) Hayes of Rosebud, SD departed for paradise on March 27, 2023. She was blessed to have walked this earth for 99 years. She was an enrolled member of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe born on February 13, 1924 in Santee, NE to Edward Godfrey, Sr and Carrie (Cherry-bud/Primeaux) Godfrey. She leaves behind her daughter Karen Weathers of Rosebud; 14 grandchildren; 67 great grandchildren; 24 great-great grandchildren and 29 nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents; brothers Narcisse and Edward Godfrey; sisters Anna (Noah Broken Leg), Doreen (Hugh McBride) and Verna (Fred Irvin); sons Thomas Espinoza, Robert Wayne Espinoza and Joseph Edward Espinosa; daughters Margaret Doreen (Espinoza) Moran, Glenda Espinoza, Mary Louise Espinoza and Delores Espinoza; and grandsons Michael Lynn Espinoza and Thomas Leon Espinosa, Sr.

Edward and Carrie Godfrey made their permanent residence at Ponca Creek Milks Camp Community in 1924 which was founded by Alma's maternal great grandfather Chief Milk (Asanpi). Together they farmed 80 acres of land along with a few cattle and raised their children on this homestead. Edward served as lay reader for 23 years at All Saints Episcopal Church at Milks Camp. Alma and siblings attended day school at Milks Camp and later attended the old boarding school at Mission, SD. Alma completed her GED at Sinte Gleska University in 1979.

Alma met and married Antonio Gutierrez Espinoza in 194? at Grand Island, NE where he was stationed in the Army/Air Force. They relocated to Stockton, CA and returned to South Dakota in 1947 where they made their home in Winner until they divorced in 1956.

Alma worked a variety of jobs which included St. Elizabeth's Episcopal Boarding School at Wakpala, SD, Rosebud Boarding School and the Checker Board Café at Mission, SD and dry cleaning businesses in Rapid City, SD and Sioux City, IA. Her last and longest employment was with the Rosebud Sioux Tribe Administrative offices in housekeeping and telephone operator for approximately 20 years. She also served as receptionist at the Sicangu Oyate Land Office on the Work Experience Program for a few years until she finally retired around 2005. She knew all the phone numbers for every program on the reservation.


